



Old Port of Montréal Corporation Contest “Treasure Hunt”

CONTEST RULES

1. Conducted by the Old Port of Montréal Corporation, the contest runs from March 8 to July 1, 2010 inclusive.

CONTEST DURATION

2. Public launch of contest: March 7, 2010, at midnight.
Contest ending: July 1, 2010, at midnight (00:00 a.m.).

ELIGIBILITY

3. The contest is open to residents of Canada age 13 or older, except for employees, agents and representatives of the Old Port of Montréal Corporation, its advertising and promotional agencies, the suppliers of the prize(s), materials and services related to the current contest or of any other agent directly related to the contest, as well as members of their immediate families (brothers, sisters, children, father, mother), their legal or de facto spouses and all persons with whom said employees, agents and representatives are domiciled.

HOW TO ENTER

4. No purchase required. To take part in this contest, each entrant must submit paper or electronic material, or material of any other type that pertains to the Old Port’s history during the 1930 to 1967 time period to the Old Port Corporation. Verbal accounts are also eligible and their relevance to this research on the Old Port of Montréal heritage will be determined by representatives from the Old Port Corporation.

All documents will be digitized and returned to their owner.

To enter the contest, each entrant must give his or her last name, first name, postal address and telephone number.

To be declared a winner, each selected entrant must correctly answer the mathematical skill-testing question that he or she will be asked via telephone by a representative of the Old Port of Montréal Corporation.

PRIZE

5. The winner and his or her guest will be awarded a “Prestige” dinner cruise aboard the Bateau-Mouche at the Old Port of Montréal. A gift certificate for the prize will be sent by mail to the winner. The prize must be used before October 1, 2010 and cannot be used on a Saturday evening when a fireworks display for L’International des Feux Loto-Québec is scheduled.
